

## Dazzling dresses in offices banned

Wearing of dazzling dresses with ornamental designs and sports wear in offices by officers and employees of government, semi-government and autonomous organisations has been banned.

The Establishment Ministry in a recent circular has also specified dresses to be worn by these officers and employees in offices and at functions attended by the President of the country.

According to the circular, at Bangabhaban and airport functions and at functions attended by the President of the country all officers are required to be attired by pajama and achkan (sherwani) with mocassin/English shoe with shocks or suit with ties with mocassin/English shoe with shocks or as specified in invitation card.

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work, the officers will be required to wear safari suit or trouser and bush shirt or trouser and shirt tucked inside the trouser or lounge or combination suit or sherwani with pajama or trouser or pajama and punjabi (optional for class-III and IV employees).

The circular noted that senior officers were found wearing dresses as they pleased at officer and government functions including functions at Bangabhaban, and hampering the decency and gravity of these functions.

Violation of directions in respect of dresses would be considered as misconduct under rule 2 (C) of the Government Employee (Discipline and Appeal) Rules of 1976.
