

## Madrasa education needs changes: Oli

CHITTAGONG Nov. 9 : Communications Minister Oli Ahmad Friday said that the Madrasa education need changes and innovations without deviating from its original objectives in

order to make it more effective in the modern society, reports BSS.

He said, the government was considering to make necessary changes in Madrasa education so that the students passing out of Madrasa could find suitable employment like others from the colleges and Universities.

Speaking as chief guest at the guardians conference held under the auspices of Darul Ulum Alia Madrasa at Chandanpura here he said the question of nationalisation of more educational institutions was being studied by the government and that a concrete decision to this effect would be announced in due time.

The conference, presided over by Mr. Ali Ahmad, Resident of the Madrasa Managing Committee was also addressed by Pir Saeb of Baitus Saraf Maulana Abdul Jabbar, Managing Committee Member Mr. Badiul Alam and Principal of the college Maulana ANM Salahuddin Al-Imami.

The Minister also stressed the need for religious education to build up man high moral character whom the society needed most when there was constant erosion of moral values and degradation. He said if every one of us strictly adhere to our own religious teaching we will be able to establish a society free of corruptions.

Mr. Oli Ahmad called upon the people to socially boycott those who lead dishonest life in society. He said the BNP government's prime objective was to establish a corruption free administration and that without people's cooperation this objective could not be realised.

The Minister assured the managing committee of the Madrasa established in 1913 of all possible help in solving various problems including building a hostel for the students.
