Hasina's call to fulfil demand of teachers

Awami League President Sheikh Hasina on Friday called for meeting the just demands of the striking teachers, saying that development of education is not possible without redressing the grievances of teachers and employees, says UNB.

Hasina made the call when a delegation of Central Teachers' Action Liaison Committee met her at 29, Minto Road on Friday evening. The Liaison Committee leaders apprised her of their current movement and future programme to press home their demands which include higher pay and other financial benefits.

Expressing concern at the government's attitude towards the demand of the non-government teachers, the opposition leader criticised the ruling party for police oppression on teachers and for not implementing the agreement signed with them.

It has become a practice of the government for violating its own agreements with different professional groups including teachers, workers, employees and even with
