

APSU submits
memorandum to

CHITTAGONG, Dec. 3.—All Party Student Unity, Chittagong University Unit today submitted a memorandum to the Deputy Commissioner Mr. A R. Khan.

The All Party Student leaders urged the Government through the Deputy Commissioner to take necessary action against them who are responsible for the attack on VC's residence on the campus recently. They also demanded arrest of the alleged killers of student leader Farukazzaman Faruk who was killed on the campus last year. They urged the Government to restore academic atmosphere on the campus and removal of 63 Islami Chhatra Shibir activists from the university.

The All Party Student leaders blamed Chatra Shibir activists for unrest in Chittagong University.

All Party Student Unity and CUCSU VP Mohammed Nazimuddin, GS Azimuddin, Chatra League leader Manjurul Alam Shahin and Anup Khastagir were present during the submission of memorandum to the Deputy Commissioner.

Meanwhile, classes and all administrative activities of Chittagong University might suffer at serious setback due to the in definite strike called by the All Party Student Unity of the University unit.

In a press release, the APSU leaders reiterated their determination to continue their action programme until their demands are materialised.

On the other hand Chittagong University Inquiry Commission Reports Bastabayana Parishad held a meeting yesterday at Muslim Hall with Mr. Afiquallah Choudhury, ex-MP in the chair. The meeting resolved that continuation of Vice-Chancellor in the office was against all moral and legal norms and criticised his inefficiency in running the university administration. The speakers at the meeting demanded of the Government to constitute yet another high-powered inquiry Commission to investigate all the allegations of corruption against the VC. They called upon all the political parties to come forward to launch a mass movement to get the Inquiry Commission Reports materialised.

The meeting was addressed by, among others, Prof. Yusuf Sarif Ahmed Khan, Prof. Abdul Nur, Advocate Badiul Alam, Dr. Abul Kalam Azad, Advocate Abdus Salam Mamun, Jahangir Chowdhury, Mahfuzul Huq, Dr. Jahirul Hoq and Abul Kalam Mallik.
