DUTA calls for political solution

The Dhaka University Teachers Association (DUTA) on Sunday urged the Government and different political parties to stop campus violence through a political solution of the problem. Expressing grave concern over recent incidents of violence on the campus DUTA demanded punishment to all those responsible for acts of terrorism.

Presided over by Professor Anwar-ullah Chowdhury, President of DUTA, the meeting expressed, regret over indifference of the police when the office of the Dean of the Faculty of Law of the University was ransacked on Sunday. The meeting also demanded punishment of

those responsible for it.

Reviewing the situation, the meeting said that the recent acts of violence on the campus was the outcome of a plan to widen the political influence of some student organisations. There should be a solution of the problem before reopening of the University, the meeting said.
