

Fresh violence erupts on DU campus

Some students of Dhaka University were injured following violence on the campus on Monday.

The trouble originated when unruly students in disguise of examinees ransacked the office of the Vice-Chancellor, opened blank fire, exploded crackers and chased the police.

They also brought out a procession in the evening chanting slogans "Examinations and elections cannot go together".

The trouble mongers then rushed to the TSC area and opened blank shots from near the Shamsunnahar Hall. They also exploded bombs.

The police on duty was chased by a section of the unruly elements. At one stage, they snatched a helmet and an armour from a fleeing policeman and broke them in front of TSC.

Panic was prevailing in TSC and adjoining areas following the bomb blasts. The panic-stricken students running helter-skelter for safety.

None was injured in the incident.

Immediately after the incident most of the student organisations brought out separate processions protesting what they said "fresh violence" on the campus.

They also held rallies separately at TSC demanding exemplary punishment of those responsible for creating violence.
