Six vehicles set ablaze in DU area

The agitated students of Dhaka University on Monday set fire to six vehicles including two motor cycles. They also damaged few other transports on the campus and its adjoining areas.

The angry students took this action in protest against the sudden police raid on the hall on the day at 12 noon.

A good number of police cordoned off the hall area on Monday to arrest the alleged killers of Dr. Milon who was killed during the anti-autocratic movement of last year. Police searched the hall to find out the culprits but could not arrest any of them.

Immediately after the raid, the Chhatra League (A-A) supporters brought out a procession protesting the raid. The processionists became violent when they reached British

Council. They set fire to three private cars and two motor cycles near the council and damaged a few other transports. They also set ablaze a jeep near the Sher-e-Bangla hall of BUET.

Later, police recovered these vehicles from the campus. Police sealed the different entry points of the university after the incident.

Meanwhile, the meeting of Dhaka University Environment Council ended inconclusively on Monday.

Prof. M. Maniruzzaman Mia, Vice-Chancellor of the University, convened the meeting of the Council to discuss ways and means to prevent the campus violence on the eve of DUCSU polls.
