Students observe fall of autocracy

The student community on Sunday observed the second anniversary of the fall of the Autocratic Regime with a call to renew the pledge of giving the democracy an institutional shape on the basis of the declaration of the three alliances.

The leaders of the most student organisations criticised the government for not realising the ten-point demand of the students and said the hopes and aspirations for which the people fought for nine years were not materialised so far.

Bangladesh Chhatra League (MI), Gonatantrik Chhatra Kendra, Bangladesh Chhatra Dal, Chhatra League (Mantoo), brought out processions and held rallies separately on Dhaka University campus to mark the day.

Leaders of BCL, the student wing of Awami League, in its rally blamed the government for pushing the country into crisis through introducing 'black laws'.

The rally, held in front of the DUCSU building, was addressed among others by BCL President Mainuddin Hasan Chowdhury, Shafiq, DU unit President K.H.M. Liza, General Secretary Pankaj Nath and central member Swapon Basu.

The BCL leaders said that the BNP government introduced anti-terrorism act to harass and oppress the leaders and workers of the political parties and said that being failed to fulfil the just demands of people the BNP government was behaving like the autocratic government did.

They criticised the government for not implementing the joint declaration of the three alliances and the ten-point demand of the students.

They also blamed the government

for what they said patronisation of the anti-liberation forces, Jamaat-Shibir, Freedom Party and Jubo Command.

Gonatantrik Chhatra Kendra held a rally in front of the Madhu's Canteen which was addressed among others by Sheikh Nurul Amin, Abul Fattah, Sabuj and Mahbubur Rahman.

Chhatra League (Mantoo) blamed Awami League and BNP for not fulfilling the demands of people and called upon the student community to build united movement to create pressure to implement the demands.

The rally held at the foot of Aparajeo Bangla, was addressed among others by BCL President Mizanur Rahman Azad, Sayed Kamrul Ashan, Mainuddin Main and Mizanur Rahman Arzu.

Bangladesh Chhatra Dal also brought out procession and held rally on Dhaka University campus to observe the day.

Chhatra Oikkya Forum in a statement on Sunday criticised the government for not implementing the ten-point demand of the students and called upon the people to build another movement to establish an exploitation free society.

Dhaka University Film Society organised a film show at TSC on Sunday evening to celebrate the mass upsurge day.
