Scientific edn policy demanded

Leaders of Bangladesh Chhatra League (M-I) at a rally on Wednesday blamed the Government for what they said failing to fulfil the aspiration of the students and urged all including teachers, students and guardians to build united movement for formulation of a scientific education policy.

Addressing a student gathering organised by BCL central committee as a part of its Education Day programme, they said that Dr. Kudrat-e-Khuda Education Commission formed by the government of Bangabandhu Sheikh Mujibur Rahman had submitted its reports regarding formulation of an education policy in time but after the change over of 1975 it was sent to cold storage.

The rally, held in front of the DUCSU building was addressed, among others, by BCL (M-I) President Moinuddin Hasan Chowdhury, Dhaka University Unit President KHM Lizu, General Secretary Pankaj Devnath, Akhtar Hossain and Gazi Mesba-ul-Hossain Chachu.

They said that the government which came to power after the killing of Bangabandhu had failed to give the nation a proper guideline and due to their "education contraction policy" crisis in the country's education sector had been aggravated.

BCL leaders said that the Government-backed Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) and Islami Chhatra
