

JUTA blames Govt for sheltering terrorists

Jahangirnagar University Teachers' Association (JUTA) at a meeting on Tuesday expressed resentment over cases filed by former JUCSU V-P against ten teachers of the University, and urged all conscious people to raise voice against the attempt to tarnish the image of the teachers community.

The meeting, presided over by JUTA President Prof. Khandaker Mustahidur Rahman, was addressed among others by Prof. Imamuddin, Prof. Mirza Aminul Haq, Prof. Jasmuddin and Prof. Sharif Inamul Kabir.

Condemning the Government's silence over the violent activities of terrorists, the meeting opined that it would not have been possible to file cases against teachers by an identified terrorist without backing and patronisation of the ruling party.

The meeting said that the University authorities have filed cases

against 21 JCD and JUCSU leaders for their involvement in the violent incident of July 29 and the Government assured that it would take necessary steps in this respects. But the recent activities against teachers community of the University had proved that the Government had been sheltering the terrorists without nabbing them, it added.

The meeting demanded immediate withdrawal of cases and necessary action against those involved in such terrorist acts.
