## JCD sweeps Dhaka College union polls

Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) swept the Students' Union election of Dhaka College by capturing all 21 posts.

Haroon-Ar-Rashid, Zabed and Mamun of the ruling party backed JCD have been elected V-P, GS and AGS respectively of the students' union. Some 161 candidates belonging to eight different panels were in the race.

Voting started at 8 a.m. and continued till 2 p.m. without any break.

Meanwhile at least forty members of pro-Awami League Chhatra League (M-I) including its V-P candidate Golam Rabbani Chenu were injured when a group of unruly youths attacked them in front of the college gate during the polls. The youths fired two rounds of blank

shots and damaged the election camp of Chhatra League (M-I).

Activists of Chhatra League (M-I) who were electioneering, were driven out from the campus by the armed youths during the election.

The pro-Awami League Chhatra League (M-I) at a Press conference on Tuesday blamed Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) and Chhatra League (Mantu) for the attack on its leaders and activists during the election of Dhaka College and demanded punishment of the attackers.

Addressing the Press conference at the National Press Club Chhatra League (M-I) leaders alleged that armed miscreants of JCD and its ally Chhatra League (Mantu) snatched the panel sheets, leaflets and voters' lists from their members and drove all Chhatra League (M-I) activists from the college campus during the polls.

The terrorists damaged the election camp of Chhatra League (M-I) and injured a dozen of leaders including Chhatra League (M-I) V-P candidate Golam Rabbani Chenu and AGS candidate Sabbir Ahmed Khan, they alleged.

They said that the violent activities of JCD had created panic among general students and a number of students could not cast their votes due to the terrorism of JCD during the polls hours.

The Press conference was attended, among others, by Chhatra League (M-I) President Moinuddin Hasan Chowdhury, Gazi Bejbaul Hossain Sachchu, Akhter Hossain, Pankaj Nath, Nazrul Islam Babu and Liaquat Ali Shikder.
