## BCL to go for anti-terrorism drive soon

The Pro-Awami League Chhatra League (BCL) will take initiative to remove terrorism from all the educational institutions of the country.

Exchanging views with journalists at the Teachers Students' Centre (TSC) of Dhaka University on Saturday the BCL leaders said, terrorism in the educational institutions was hampering the academic atmosphere in the educational institutions of the country. This will weaken the nation in the task of facing the challenge of the 21st century.

Replying to a question the leaders denied giving any shelter to terrorists in their organisation. They further said some crooks were committing crimes by using the banner of Chhatra League.

The BCL announced a 17-point demand which, among others, include computerisation of the educational system so that the students get the access to the world of computer introduction of a more effective co-curricular activities and establishment of foreign communication cell.

Chhatra League is going to take a Master Plan for the welfare of the students of the country.

Part of their plan is to award scholarships to a certain number of students of Dhaka University in order of merit.

The BCL leaders expressed determination to announce a full-fledged committee of the organisation within a very short time. They said that they could not complete the formation of the committee as the process was disrupted by the unrest created by the Oppositions recently.

"Besides, we were busy guarding any kind of conspiracy against the Verdict of the Bangabandhu Murder Case, they said.
