

Unfair Means In Examination

Sir,

I have had the opportunity to visit some Secondary School Certificate (SSC) Examination Centres in the northern part of the country. However, I found that some students adopted unfair means at the examination hall, even, they dared take books to the hall, and some teachers also helped them in doing this. The government is trying to improve the standards of education through the objective type of questions. This has, however, not improved the standard of education and the real talent is not judged due to lack of proper examination system. The object of education is to acquire knowledge, but nowadays the main aim of education seems to receive a certificate. That's why the number of unemployed educated youths is being created.

I would like to suggest to the SSC and HSC Board of Education the following proposals: The teacher or invigilator who is found helping unfair means at the examination hall must be suspended at once.

The examination committee member should be responsible and honest.

The board authority is to cancel those centres which allow students so as to gather money.

Students should be properly coached by teachers prior to the examination.

The students from the very beginning of their academic career should be urged upon the importance of regular study, discipline, understanding the value of time, etc.
