Degree results announced Pass percentage BA 37.47, B.Com 47.71, B.Sc 46.74

The results of degree (pass) and certificate course examinations of 1995 (held in 1996) of the National University (NU) were announced on Thursday.

According to a Press release of the university, a total of 1,81,135 students, including 49,015 females, from 645 degree colleges across the country appeared in the examinations, held under the NU for the first time. Of them 70,877 came out successful.

The percentage of pass in arts is 37.47 (BA), social sciences 38.43 (BSS), commerce 47.71 (B.Com) and science group 46.74 (BSc).

The percentage of pass in B.Mus is

35.29 and in certificate course is 40.20.

A total of 1,20,220 students appeared in the BA (pass) examinations, of whom 45,055 came out successful. Seventy of them secured first class, 19,625 second class and 25,360 third class.

Abul Barkat M. Fakhruddin (Roll No. P 31930), a private examinee from Jessore M M College centre, stood first in the BA (pass) examination securing 664 marks.

A total of 32,303 students appeared in the BSS (pass) examinations, of whom 12,415 came out successful. Only one got first class,

4,552 second class and 7,862 third class.

M. Abdul Kabir of Chittagong College (Roll No. 162630) stood first in BSS obtaining 601 marks.

In B.Com (pass) examinations, 19,947 students appeared, of them 9,517 came out successful. Nine of them got first class, 3,993 second class and 5,515 third class.

Nahid Islam of Siddheswari Degree College (Roll No. M 171745) stood first in B.Com securing 671 marks.

A total of 6,238 students appeared in B.Sc (pass) examination, of them 2,916 students came out successful. Sixty six were placed in first class, 2,170 in second class, and 680 in third class.

Adline D'Cruze of Tejgaon College (Roll No. M 190776) topped the merit list of B.Sc securing 661 marks.

In certificate course examination, 956 students passed, out of 2,378 appeared.

A total of 51 students appeared in the Bachelor of Music (B Mus) examination, of them 18 came out successful. None got first class in this group. Seventeen obtained second class and only one got third class.
