Guardians of 132 HSC examinees submit memo

Guardians of 132 HSC examinees of Motijheel Model High School & College on Sunday submitted a memorandum to the Prime Minister and Education Minister demanding their children be allowed to appear in the ensuing examination, reports UNB.

They brought out a silent procession from the Kamalapur Railway Station that ended at the National Press Club. They will demonstrate and go for daylong hunger strike on Tuesday at the National Press Club if their demand is not met by today (Monday).

"We, the guardians of 132 HSC examinees submitted the memorandum to Abul Kalam Azad, Director (Administration) of the Prime Minister's office and directly talked with the Education Minister," Jafar Ahmed Bhuiyan, one of the guardians told UNB Sunday evening.

"We went to file two cases against the college authorities, one protesting repression on the girl students and the other for misappropriating money of the students and cheating them. But the Motijheel thana police had just received our application and refused to take the case," Jafar Ahmed said.

Later he telephoned to say that the police accepted the case at 9 on Sunday night.

Police Thursday morning resorted to lathicharge twice to disperse the agitating girl students of the college who will not be able to appear in the examination scheduled for April 27 due to, what they said, negligence and lapses of the college management.
