**Notice for Admission in the First
Year Class of B.Sc. Engineering,
Session 1981-82.**

Applications in forms prescribed and supplied by the Chittagong Engineering College authority are invited from candidates having the following general qualifications and willing to be admitted through an admission test to be conducted by the College authority for filling up the 120 (One hundred twenty) seats of the First Year class of Session 1981-82 of the four-year engineering courses to be offered only in Civil Engineering and Electrical Engineering branches leading to the degree of B.Sc. Engineering of the Chittagong University according to its latest Ordinances for the award of the said degree. Essential information in brief is given hereunder.

1. NO. OF SEATS : Civil Engineering=60, Electrical Engineering=60.

3. PROCEDURE FOR SEAT RESERVATION :

- A merit list among the candidates of each of above categories in the declining order of merit will be prepared on the results of the admission test subject to conditions given hereunder in paragraph No 5.
- Half of the number of seats under general quota, i.e. fifty five seats will first be filled up on the basis of above merit list from amongst the candidates passing their H.S.C. examinations from a College situated within the Chittagong Division and the remaining seats will then be filled up in order of merit from the remaining candidates of the list.
- Of the seats ear-marked for tribal candidates, two seats are for those from the Chittagong Hill Tracts, one seat is for the tribals of Bundarban and the remaining are for tribals of the country in general. Candidates applying for seats reserved for the Chittagong Hill Tracts and Bundarban will need to have passed their H.S.C. examinations from a College situated inside the Chittagong Division. Candidates seeking admission against the seat reserved for Bundarban will need to apply through the G.O.C., 24th Division of the Bangladesh Army. First preference for admission will be given to candidates from the Chittagong Hill Tracts in seats falling vacant due to nonavailability of suitable tribal candidates in general and from Bundarban. Admission in these seats will be in order of merit as mentioned in 3(a) above.
- Candidates from the Armed Forces will need to apply through the Master General of Ordnance or the Engineers Directorate. Attention of such candidates is drawn to Memo. No. Engg/875 dt. 9.6.1981 of this College to these authorities.
- A candidate who is not a citizen of Bangladesh will need to apply through the Ministry of Education, Government of Bangladesh, for admission in seats reserved for foreign nationals.
- The sum total of vacant seats of Category 3(c), 3(d) and 3(e) due to non-availability of suitable candidates will be filled up from amongst the residuals of the merit list of general candidates in the manner described in 3(b) above.
- If the number of candidates eligible for admission from amongst those who passed their H.S.C. examinations from a College in the Chittagong Division as described in 3(b) falls short of the number of seats for such candidature then these seats will be made open for the remaining candidates of the general merit list.

GENERAL ELIGIBILITY OF A CANDIDATE:

- A candidate will have to have passed the S.S.C. & H.S.C. (or

tion recognised equivalent thereto. No grace mark is to be included in this calculation. Any of these subjects may well have been his additional or fourth subject in the said examination.

- If the H.S.C. Examination of a candidate, or an examination recognised equivalent thereto, was held in the year 1981 then he will need to have secured in average at least 55% (fifty-five per cent) of the combined total of marks in Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry. This average mark is 58% (fifty-eight per cent) in the least in case of all other candidates. No grace mark is to be included in this calculation.

- A Bangladeshi citizen who has passed the S.S.C. or its equivalent examination in the manner described in 4(a) above and has passed the Diploma-in-Engineering Examination of the Bangladesh Technical Education Board in First Division, may become a candidate.

- In general a candidate will need to be mentally and physically fit for continuous mental and physical labour over a long period. Physical deformity, defective vision, hard stammering or mental imbalance of a person will generally make him unfit for candidature.

- ADMISSION TEST : A candidate willing to seek admission will need to sit in a written admission test of three hours duration, conducted under the total control of the authority of this College, on the syllabi of Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry of the H.S.C. Examinations of 1981 held in Bangladesh. This test will be held sometime in February, 1982. Candidates securing 30% (thirty per cent) or more marks in this test will be considered eligible to seek admission and will be included in the required merit list mentioned in 3(a). The question papers will be written in Bangla and English and the examinees will also have to answer in either Bangla or English.

- WOMEN CANDIDATES : No distinction is made between male and female in selecting candidates for admission or in any sphere of academic requirements subsequent to admission. There is no hostel for female students in the Chittagong Engineering College and the College authority expresses inability to make any special provision for female students.

- OTHER RELEVANT CONDITIONS: Detailed information on matters in addition to those described heretofore and informations regarding the filling up of the prescribed form will be found in papers supplied along with the Form for seeking admission.

8. PROCEDURE FOR COLLECTING FORMS :

A set of application forms may be collected personally during the office hours of the College, or by post, on written application addressed to the Principal, Chittagong Engineering College, Post Office : Chittagong Engineering College, Chittagong, enclosing with it a bank draft of Tk. 10/- (Taka Ten only) (non-refundable) drawn on the Pahartali (Choumohani) Branch of the Sonali Bank or on the Unsattar Para Branch of the Bangladesh Krishi Bank in favour of the "Chairman, Admission Committee, Chittagong Engineering College." A self-addressed 5"x11" envelope stamped worth Tk. 5/- (Five) of unused stamp is to be included with the application for form if the same is to be collected by post. Forms will be distributed on requests received from 9.11.1981 till 31.12.81 and no more forms will be distributed even if such request arrives by mail after that date. The last date of receiving applications seeking admission is 18.1.1982. No excuse of any sort will be entertained on the plea of postal or other anomaly. No cash or postal order in lieu of Bank Draft will be accepted.
