

Rajbari primary students yet to get complete set of books

RAJBARI, Jan. 10:—A total of 2,29,547 pieces of books out of 3,99,141 sanctioned has been received by the District Primary Education Office upto December 14 for distribution among 1,69,074 students both boys and girls reading in 414 primary schools of the district.

A source of the District Primary Education Office said that if the rest 1,06,594 pieces of sanctioned books reach the office in a week, the office would be able to send these books to respective schools in the district before the commencement of the next academic session beginning from January.

Some guardians of the primary students from their past experiences apprehend that their wards will not get their books in time.

The concerned authority is requested to exert allout efforts so that the students reading in primary schools across the district get their complete set of books in time.

No passenger shed
