DR. G. C. DEV

Killed on March 25, 1971, by the occupation forces Dr. G. C. Dev was one of the reputed philosophers of the country.

SHAHIDULLAH KAISER

The then Joint Editor of the Daily Sangbad, Mr. Shahidullah Kaiser was a well known as a litterateur and President of East Pakistan Union of Journalist. He was picked up by the Al-Badr from his Kayetuli residence and killed.

MUNIR CHOWDHURY

A Professor of Bengali in the Dacca University, Munir Chowdhury was a prominent Bengali writer. He was kidnapped from his Central Road residence and later killed by the Al-Badr.

SIRAJUDDIN HOSSAIN

One of the eminent journalists of the country, Mr. Sirajuddin Hossain was the News Editor of the Daily Ittefaq. He was picked up by the Al-Badr on December 10 and killed.

MOFAZZAL HAIDER CHOWDHURY

A professor of Bengali in the Dacca University, Mr. Chowdhury was well versed in Tagore literature.

RASHIDUL HASSAN

professor of Political

Science, Dacca University Mr. Hassan joined the university in 1967. His body was also found at Mirpur.

DR. FAIZUL MOHI

A professor in the Institute of Education and Research, Dacca University the body of Dr. Mohi was also identified at Mirpur.

LADU BHAI

Syed Abdul Mannan alias Ladu Bhai was Sports Editor of the then Pakistan Observer. A man of amiable disposition, Ladu Bhai was picked up by the Al-Badr only a couple of days before the country was liberated.

MR. NIZARUDDIN AHMED

Mr. Ahmed was the Bureau Chief of the then Pakistan Press International. He was kidnapped and killed by the Al-Badr.

ABUL BASHAR

A young journalist, Mr. Abul Bashar of the then Morning News actively took part in the war of liberation. He was killed by Pakistan Army.

ANWAR PASHA

A professor of Bengali

Department of the Dacca University. Anwar Pasha was a rising poet and novelist. He was killed at Mirpur along other intellectuals.

GHYASUDDIN AHMED

Mr. Ghyasuddin was a professor of History and house tutor of Mohsin Hall when he was kidnapped by the Al-Badr. He was a bachelor. His mutilated body was recovered from a ditch at Mirpur on December 17, 1971.

DR. KHAIR

A professor of History of the Dacca University, Dr. Khair was also a victim in the hands of the Al-Badr. His body was also identified at Mirpur.

MR. SANTOSH BHATTACHARYA

A professor of History, Mr. Bhattacharya was also kidnapped along with other intellectuals on December 14 and killed at Mirpur.

DR. MOHAMMAD MURTAZA

Dr. Murtaza was serving the Dacca University as a

physician. His body was also identified at Mirpur along with other Shahid intellectuals.

DR. FAZLE RABBI

A Dacca Medical College Hospital teacher Dr. Fazole Rabbi was one of those few who rendered valuable services to the freedom fighters in those days of turmoil. Another eminent physician who was also kidnapped and killed by the Al-Badr fanatics was Dr. Alim Chowdhury.

A. N. M. GHULAM MUSTAFA

A promising young journalist, Mr. Mustafa was the shift in-charge of the now defunct Purbodesh.

ABUL KALAM AZAD

A scientist, Abul Kalam Azad, also fell victim in the hands of the Al-Badr on the eve of independence of the country.

SELINA PERVIN

The Al-Badr did not spare the women intellectuals took Editor of Monthly 'Shilalipi' Selina Pervin was kidnapped and killed by the Al-Badr.

SYED NAZMUL HUQ

Syed Nazmul Huq was the Chief Reporter of PPI. He was kidnapped and killed by Al-Badr.
