

Abul Fazal laid to rest

CHITTAGONG May 5:—Prof. Abul Fazal eminent litterateur and educationist of the country was laid to rest at Kazir Dewri mosque graveyard this afternoon.

His Namaj-e-Janaza was held immediately after Joir prayer at Chittagong Circuit House maidan. Several thousand people from all walks of life attended the Janaza. ZMLA Major-General Abdul Mannaf and Chittagong University VC Dr. Abdul Aziz Khan also attended it.

Thousands of people thronged his Kazir Dewri residence immediately after the spread of death news of Prof. Abul Fazal in the morning. The people throughout the day entered the residence in queues and passed by his bed-side in silence to have a last glimpse and to pay respect to the eminent litterateur. A condolence book was also opened at his residence for the signature of visitors.

Among the prominent persons who visited his residence were Vice-Chancellor of Chittagong University Prof. Abdul Aziz Khan Consul General of Soviet Consulate in Chittagong Mr. George K. Groushetsky Assistant High Commissioner of India in Chittagong Mr. D.K. Sarkar.

The Soviet Consul General also handed over a condolence message of Soviet Ambassador in Bangladesh Mr. V.P. Stepanov to members of the bereaved family.

Professor Abul Fazal during his life time received many awards for his outstanding literary works. His prominent books include Chouahir Rekha Chitro Shamakal Durgi-er Dusali Lekhoker Ro... and Ranga Robhal.

Prof. Fazal received Bangla Jemiy award for literature in 1962 President's Pride of Performance award in 1963 and Adamjee Award in 1965. (Continued on page 12 col. 7)

After liberation of the country he was awarded Ekushey Padak Nasiruddin Sarna Padak and Muktadhar Shahitya Medal. Shamakal Shahitya Gosthi honoured him with the title of Banglar Bibek.

Prof. Abul Fazal a former Education Minister was also associated with the University Association. He pursued his long career in teaching in different colleges including Chittagong Government College and retired in the year 1959.

He held the office of Vice-Chancellor of Chittagong University from 1973 to 1975. He joined the Council of Advisers of President Abu Sadat Mohammad Sayem in 1975. Late Abul Fazal continued in the same post even in the cabinet of former President Ziaur Rahman till 1977.

Prof. Fazal was born at Kewchia in Satkania thana under Chittagong district in 1903 in a respectable Muslim family. His father was late Maulvi Fazlur Rahman.
