Khan Bahadur Abdul Hakim dies

Khan Bahadur Abdul Hakim a former Director of Public Instructions (DPI) and a renowned educationist died of a heart attack at the Suhrawardy Hospital in Dhaka on Friday morning, reports ESS.

He was 80.

According to family source late Abdul Hakim had a stroke on Thursday morning and was immediately taken and admitted to the Suhrawardy Hospital. He was under intensive care till his death.

His nazraz-e-Jenaza was held at Dhaka University mosque after juma prayer and was later buried at Banani graveyard.

Late Mr. Hakim was honoured by the Ekushey Award of the President in 1982 for his outstanding contribution in the spread of education. He wrote a number of books on education.

He left behind his wife, one son, six daughters and a host of relatives and well-wishers to mourn his death.
