No BUET classes today due to teachers strike

Classes of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) scheduled from today (Sunday) will not begin due to the ongoing movement of BUET Teachers' Association.

The BUETTA has been observing full work abstention from October 28 demanding the removal of V-C Prof M Shahjahan. BUETTA charged the V-C for corruption, autocratic, discriminatory activities and continuous repression on teachers.

The results of Term Final examinations ended on October 12 have not yet been published and the scheduled registration from November 10 to 14 could not be held due to BUETTA work abstention.

The BUET Unit President of Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) Habib Ahmed Murad and the General Secretary Shahidullah Khan in a joint statement on Saturday expressed grave concern over the deteriorating situation in the BUET.

They said, as the results of Term Final examinations have not yet been published and no registration was held so it was uncertain from when the classes of BUET will be started. In this situation the educational life of general students was facing threat, they added.

They demanded immediate removal of what they said, "incompetent" V-C to ease up the deadlock in the BUET. They also demanded withdrawal of restriction on student politics in the BUET.

In separate statements leaders of BUET Unit Chhatra Union and Samajtantrik Chhatra Front demanded the resignation of the V-C Prof M Shahjahan and removal of restriction on student politics in the BUET.

On the other hand, general students of BUET are also in great anxiety as the impasse in the BUET has not yet been removed.

Everyday many students come to the campus to know about the real situation, but they go back without any certain information.
