

## CU teachers concerned over terrorism

One hundred eighteen teachers of Chittagong University in a joint statement on Saturday expressed their serious concern over the activities of a particular student organisation leading to stalemate in the academic atmosphere of the university.

The signatories to the statement said the particular student organisation in its bid to realise 7-point programme recently locked the offices of different halls, gheraoed the administrative building and forced the university authorities to cancel the second year honours final year examinations of the university.

The signatories alleged that the terrorism of the particular student organisation disturbed the academic atmosphere of the university which was coming to normal with the joint efforts of the teachers and general students.

The signatories further criticised the role of the President and General Secretary of the Chittagong University Teachers Association and alleged that their recent statement was supportive to the terrorism of the particular student organisation. The Chittagong University Teachers Association acted in support of the particular student organisation in shifting the examination date which would further add to the session jam, they alleged.
