All about K. G. schools

The establishment of so many kindergarten institutions here and there have to a great extent eased the admission problem of the numerous student seeking to enter the educational arena. Some kindergarten schools no doubt charge a higher rate of tuition fee. But the guardians of wards voluntarily pay the same and so there need not be any murmuring for that. We find there are several cadet schools and colleges in the country where edu-

cational expenses are very high not only for the students but also for the Govt. It was said that the amount spent to educate a student in a cadet school can meet the expenditure of 35 students studying in other schools. But there is no hue and cry for that.

What is very important is that kindergarten or any other school should function properly to cater to the needs of the students.

It is not also very much true to say that all K. G. schools are running on commercial basis. If that be so,

they had to face unnatural death before long because parents and guardians by watching their performances would have discontinued their sympathy, without which no institution can survive.

It is of great hope that govt has since taken certain care in respect of K. G. schools and as a primary step compulsion has been placed on their institutions to prescribe books which are approved by the Board.

One thing however is of great importance that like other institutions these K. G. schools should also be put under an Inspectorate, so

that their activities are periodically watched and the institutions not running on sound basis should be put to acid test either to improve their standard or to succumb.

It is accordingly imperative that Govt should come forward to play more dominant role to bring the K. G. schools on sound footing where it miserably lags and earn the appreciation of the people who have certain grievances in this regards.

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
