

# 58.40pc pass HSC exam results

## Dacca HSC exam.

The percentage of pass of the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations of 1980 of the Dacca Education Board is 58.40, according to the results announced on Saturday.

Of the total 85,888 candidates who appeared at the examinations from different groups, 20,959 candidates came out successful with 2,078 in First Division, 6,962 in Second Division and 11,939 in Third Division.

In Science Group the percentage of pass is 64.25. Out of 16,044 candidates in the group 10,308 passed the examination—1,831 in First Division, 4,289 in Second Division and 4,188 in Third Division.

Of the total 14,578 candidates in Humanities Group, 7,609 came out successful with 147 in First Division, 1,603 in Second Division and 5,796 in Third Division; the percentage of pass being 51.48.

The percentage of pass in Commerce Group is 69.55. Out of 4,621 candidates in the group 61 secured First Division, 925 Second Division and 1,776 got Third Division.

In Islamic Studies Home Economics Agriculture and Music groups the percentages of pass are 73.70, 45.55, 14 and 72.22 respectively.

Sultan Ahmed (Dacca 11649) of Residential Model School, Dacca, topped the combined merit list by securing a total of 916 marks. He obtained letter marks in physics, chemistry, mathematics and biology.

Farhad Fuad Islam (Dacca 10660) of Dacca College, stood second in the combined merit list by securing 906 marks with letter marks in physics, chemistry and mathematics.

Nashrin Yasmeen (Mymen F42845) of Muninunnessa Women's College, Mymensingh, stood first in the Humanities Group. She obtained a total of 763 marks with letter marks in mathematics and logic.

Mohammad al-Marouf Khan (Dacca 3300) of Dacca College stood first in Commerce Group. He secured 749 marks with letter marks in accountancy.

## BNIOS team arriving Dacca shortly

An eight-member delegation from the British Nationalised Industries Overseas Service (BNIOS) will arrive in Dacca shortly to discuss investments in the public sectors particularly in the fields of mining mineral resources, shipping steel industry and power resources, reports BSS.

An official release quoting a message from London said this was a follow-up of the meeting held between President Ziaur Rahman and Bangladesh Planning Minister Dr Fashjuddin Mahtab with Dame Judith Hart and representatives of the British Nationalised Industries Overseas Service during the President's recent visit to the United Kingdom.

The release said the Bangladesh High Commissioner, Mr A R Shams-ud-Doha, was the chief guest at the BNIOS quarterly meeting held in London on October 14. In the meeting Sir Derek Ezra, Chairman of BNIOS spoke warmly of the leader of Bangladesh and the great stride Bangladesh had been making in economic development.

It said the High Commissioner was the principal speaker at the meeting in which 30 top representatives including Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Managing Directors of the nationalised industries in the United Kingdom were present.

Mr Doha in his speech outlined the massive efforts being made by Bangladesh to become self-reliant through rural development. He spoke at length on the country's Second Five-Year Plan which laid special emphasis on the development of natural resources, shipping and power generation.
