

## Chancellor urged to take steps for CU V-C's removal

Chittagong University Teachers Association (CUTA) on Sunday urged Acting President Mr. Justice Shahabuddin Ahmed to take steps for removal of Professor Alamgir M. Sirajuddin, Vice-Chancellor of Chittagong University and thus save the institution. The decision of removal of the Vice-Chancellor is in conformity with the recommendation of the Enquiry Commission report, CUTA added.

Yusuf Sharif Ahmed Khan and Dr. A. Kalam Azad President and General Secretary respectively of CUTA in a joint statement on the day held the Vice-Chancellor responsible for resorting to act of terrorism for keeping the University closed. They also brought charges against the University administration

for foiling the movement of CUTA. The administration of the University has been held responsible for creating acts of violence on the campus even in the recently submitted reports of the enquiry commission, the CUTA leaders alleged.

They also expressed apprehension of outbreak of violence at any time. They hoped that the government would take necessary steps to save the university and restore congenial atmosphere.

BSS adds: A meeting of the Chittagong University Teachers on Sunday called upon the Chancellor of the University, Acting President Justice Shahabuddin Ahmad and the Prime Minister Begum Khaleda Zia to publish the Inquiry Commission report on December 22 incident and implement Commission's suggestions to end the long drawn crisis of the University.

The meeting held on the campus under the auspices of Chittagong University Jatiyatabadi Shikkok Parishad with its convener Dr. Mahfuzul Huq presiding also urged the teachers to shun all political and sectional prejudices and come forward to end the stalemate of the University, a Press release of the Parishad said on Sunday.

It urged the vested group to refrain from holding meeting and Press Conference and making Press statements in the name of general teachers of the University.
