

## CU museum silver jubilee celebrations begin today

CHITTAGONG, Nov 7: The five-day celebrations marking the silver jubilee of Chittagong University Museum begins tomorrow.

The programmes include seminar, documentary film show, photo exhibition and tree plantation.

Professor Abdul Mannan, Vice-Chancellor of the University, will inaugurate the programme.

Four seminars will be held on "Why we will go to the museum," "To protect history and tradition through audio visual," "Higher humanities exercise: importance of research elements protection by universities" and "Hitherto unknown Harikela coins: some analytical comments." The keynote papers will be presented by Prof Anisuzzaman of Dhaka University, Mohammad Jahangir, TV presenter, Professor Imran Hossain of Chittagong University and Basanta Chowdhury, an eminent numismatist from Calcutta.

Four documentary films — "Sent Martin Dip," "Sonargoan," "Cidiram-A Bangladesh 71" and "Lal Dhigir Boli Khela" — will be shown and a solo photo exhibition has been arranged at the museum gallery for five days.

## Shankar's Children's Competition '99

The rules for Shankar's International Children's Competition 1999 has been announced, says a press release.

The competition is open to children all over the world, born on or after January 1, 1983. There is no entry fee and competitors are free to choose the theme or subject for their paintings, drawings or writings.

Paintings or drawings can be in any medium and any number of entries may be submitted. The size of each entry should not be less than 30cm x 40cm, and should not be mounted or framed.

For written work, entries must be in English and may be in the form of poems, plays, short stories, essays or descriptive writing. Any number of entries may be submitted and they should be in neat handwriting or be typed. Translations from

other languages will not be considered.

All entries should carry the following information in English block letters: first name, middle name, surname, boy or girl, date of birth, nationality, full postal address and subject or title — at the back of the painting or drawing, or at the end of the written work, and be certified by a parent, guardian or teacher as being the original, unaided work of the competitor done during 1998.

All packets must be pre-paid or adequately stamped and mailed directly to: Shankar's International Children's Competition/ Nehru House/ 4, Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg/ New Delhi-110002/ India. The last date for receipt of entries is December 31, 1998.
