Resumption of CU classes demanded

CHITTAGONG, Feb. 10:—The students of Chittagong University in a memorandum to the Vice Chancellor today demanded immediate resumption of their classes.

The students in their memorandum firmly pledged to attend their classes overcoming "all hurdles and obstructions."

A good number of students under the banner of General Students Parishad met Vice Chancellor Prof. Abdul Mannan at his residence, submitted the memorandum and called for resumption of their classes.

Meanwhile, the university authority formed an 8-member committee to contact student bodies and work out a solution to the crisis. The committee is headed by Dr. Emran Hossain, Dean of Arts Faculty.

The academic life in Chittagong University remained paralysed for past 24 days, due to an enforcement of siege to the campus gate by the supporters of the Islami Chhatra Shibir.

Removal of VC demanded

CU Correspondent adds The activists of All Party Students Unity (APSU) today observed a token hunger strike in front of Chittagong Press Club to press home their demands that included removal of VC, Pro-VC, Proctor and Provosts of Chittagong University.

However, APSU today observed their strike programme for tenth consecutive day today.

APSU enforced strikes in the university for an indefinite period since February 1 after 17-day siege programme demanding release of 54 Shibir activists and arrest of the killers of December 19 incident where two Shibir activists were killed in a gun-fight with Chhatra League.
