making body of the university took the decision in its emergency meeting on Monday with the Vice-Chancellor Prof. M. Maniruzzaman Miah in the chair.

The syndicate also decided to resume the administrative activities of the residential halls today (Tuesday) and reopened those for the inmates from 7 a.m. tomorrow (Wednesday).

The government closed down all the educational institutions of the metropolis by an emergency Press Note on the night of October 13 and asked the inmates to vacate their respective dormitories by 9 a.m. the following day.

The syndicate members took the decision after an elaborate discussion on the opinions of the leaders of All Party Students' Unity (APSU), Dhaka University Central Students Union (DACSU), hall students unions, provosts and house tutors of the residential halls and senior teachers of the university.

The Vice-Chancellor told the syndicate members that the student leaders had assured the administration of all possible cooperation to run the academic activities smoothly and in a conducive atmosphere. The student leaders will not bring out any procession in the corridors during the class hours, resist any kind of anarchy such as damaging and burning of vehicles and lodging of armed outsiders in the residential halls, the Vice-Chancellor added.

Prof. M. Maniruzzaman Miah also assured the members that the student leaders would extend their cooperation with any kind of measure taken by the authority to ensure security of the teachers, students and officials on the campus.
