



Students lack minimum facilities in dormitories, says DU VC

Prof. Moniruzzaman Miah, Vice-Chancellor of the Dhaka University on Tuesday said the living condition of the students in the dormitories was very poor, reports BSS.

He said, the students lacked minimum facilities. The unhealthy living conditions and poor bathroom and other facilities along with other social phenomena made the students frustrated.

Addressing a seminar Tuesday evening on "prevention of drug abuse and rehabilitation," organised by Rotary Club of Dhaka, the Vice-Chancellor said: sharpening of social distinction between the poor and the rich; lack of job opportunities and frustration containing the idea that 'our society has no future' pushed the students towards addiction.

He said, "if such are the conditions, what good results can we expect from them?"

The Vice-Chancellor said, when we would speak on drug or on such subjects, we should think about the entire society.

Presided over by A.K.M. Anisul Islam, the seminar was also addressed by Prof. S.P.S. Pruthi, Dr. Mofiz Chowdhury and Abdul Mannan.

Mr. Abdul Mueyed Chowdhury and Prof. A.K.M. Nazimuddowla Chowdhury presented key note papers on "towards a drug free Bangladesh" and "role of NGO in prevention of drug abuse and its rehabilitation" respectively.
