

Campus peace to be maintained, Matin tells DU VC

The Vice-Chancellor of Dhaka University Prof M Maniruzzaman Mia met Home Minister Abdul Matin Chowdhury at his Secretariat office on Saturday, reports BSS.

They reviewed the latest situation of law and order in campus and various steps to restore and maintain it. They also discussed special measures to ensure peace and normalcy in the campus during examination which would commence from November 12.

Reiterating the government's firm determination the Home Minister assured the Vice Chancellor all necessary effective measures would be taken to maintain congenial atmosphere in the campus especially during the examination.

The Home Minister sought all-out cooperation of teachers and student communities of Dhaka University in this respect.

4 PARTIES

Meanwhile, four political parties on Saturday expressed concern at the deterioration of law and order in the educational institutions and called upon all concerned to come forward unitedly to stop the growing campus violence.

Presided over by CPB leader Nurul Islam Nahid, the meeting, held at the CPB office, was attended by the Representatives of Communist Party, National Awami Party, Samiyabadi Dal and Gano Azadi Dal.

Leaders of Bangladesher Samajtanrik Dal (BSD) on Saturday called upon the government and the political parties to take up effective measures for rooting out terrorism from the educational institutions of the country.

They also called for ensuring independence and impartiality of judiciary and giving autonomy to Radio and Television, a party Press release said.

They were speaking at a meeting at the Bangabandhu Avenue organised in connection with the observance of the 74th anniversary of Great November Revolution and the 11th Founding Anniversary of BSD.
