Outsiders asked to vacate DU dorms

The Dhaka University authorities Tuesday circulated another notice among the residents of all the halls underlining that only the residents and legally authorised students would be allowed to stay in dormitories, reports UNB.

The hall authorities would not be responsible if police take any action against unauthorised residents found in any halls, the circular said.

Only the guests of resident students can stay in the halls for a short time with necessary permission from the hall authorities. But the circular imposed a ban on guests in the halls till October 31.

It asked the unauthorised students to vacate their seats immediately and urged all resident students to always carry

their identity cards with them.

The circular warned against carrying firearms inside the halls and hall compounds and said that if any students are found with arms, stern action will be taken against them.

All outsiders and unauthorised students have been asked to leave the halls immediately and residents of other halls residing in a different hall have been asked to go back to their own halls. Otherwise, the hall authorities will take legal action against them, the circular warned.

The hall authorities will not bear any responsibilities if the law enforcing agency detains anybody for violating laws within any hall premises.

The circular said that the main gates of the halls will be locked after 12 midnight and opened at 5 am.

Earlier on September 7, the university authorities had issued another circular warning against giving shelter to any outsiders and terrorist elements in the residential halls.
