

DU protest rally against campus violence

Teachers, officers and employees of Dhaka University brought out a joint procession and held a rally in the city on Tuesday demanding arrest and trial of those responsible for attack on employees.

The largely attended procession started from the Registrar's Building at 10.30 a.m. and paraded the streets in front of TSC, Doel Chattar, Curzon Hall before the termination at the Central Shaheed Minar.

The Dhaka University Teachers' Association (DUTA), Officers Association and Employees Association jointly took the programme in protest against the violent incident of November 1 that left one student dead and three employees injured at the University Registrar's building.

After the procession, a brief rally was held at the Central Shaheed Minar which was addressed, among others, by DUTA Vice-President Prof. Sayeed-Ur-Rahman, Employees Union President A.B.M. Abul Kashem Khan, Officers' Association President Muhammad Selim, Karigory Karmachary Union leader

Md. Amzad Hossain and Fourth Class Employees Union President Md. Nurul Islam.

Speakers at the rally expressed their firm determination to eliminate violence from the campus and called upon all to continue movement against campus violence.

They demanded adequate security to teachers, officers and employees on the campus.
