

## DU syndicate polls 31 nomination papers submitted

A total of 31 nomination papers were submitted against 13 posts for the election of syndicate, academic council and finance committee of Dhaka University on the last day of submission of nomination papers on Saturday. The last date for withdrawal of the candidatures is November 4.

Awami League backed "Blue panel" and BNP supported "White panel" submitted nomination papers for all the 13 posts separately while "Pink panel," a platform of the left-leaning teachers submitted nomination papers for five posts — four in the syndicate and one in finance committee.

One thousand and twenty three (1023) voters will exercise their voting rights to elect six of their representatives in the syndicate, six in the academic council and one in the finance committee for two years in the election scheduled for November 12.

Sources said that the elections were delayed by more than three months due to the century's worst flood. The last elections were held in June, 1996.

Treasurer of the University Prof. M. Shamsul Haque will conduct the elections scheduled to be held at the TSC on the day from 9 a.m. to 1 p.m. without any break. The results will be announced the same day.

Another "White group" backed by BNP's ally Jamaat-e-Islami are not contesting in the election. Confidential sources said that most of the Jamaat backed "White group" teachers, who usually give their support in favour of BNP backed "White panel" might not extend their support to their ally as they give nomination to Abdul Momin Chowdhury for the professor category in syndicate.
