GCO calls strike at DU July 26, 27

Ganotantrik Chhatra Oikya (GCO) observed strike in the Dhaka University on Thursday.

GCO called the strike in the university in protest against the enhancement of tuition fee and other charges by the university authorities and demanding resignation of the Treasurer of the university.

The GCO members announced a two-day student strike in the university on July 26 and 27 on the same issue.

The leaders of Chhatra Oikya, a conglomerate of five left-leaning student organisations, announced the programme at a rally.

The academic and administrative activities in the university could not be held. The administrative building, the central library and all other buildings in the university were under lock and key.

The rally held in front of the DUCSU building of the university was addressed, among others, by GCO leaders Ziaul Haq Zia, Monzoor-e-Khoda Torik, Saifur Rahman Tapan, Imam Gazalli and Mohsin Sarker.

Addressing the rally, the GCO leaders thanked the general students for making the strike programme a success. They also urged the university authorities to meet their demands.

BCL rally

Ruling party's student front Bangladesh Chhatra League (BCL) at a rally on Thursday urged the Dhaka University authorities to hold meeting with the leaders of the student bodies to resolve the crisis created following the enhancement of tuition fee and other fees.
