11 DU departments delay publication of Honours results

Dhaka University authorities on Saturday summoned chairmen of 11 departments and chiefs of examination committees to immediately publish results of honours examinations, reports APB.

Campus sources said the departments, which were served with a common letters, had failed to publish their honours results even after 10 months of completion of the exams.

The department include Law, International Relation, Economics, Marketing, Public Administration, Sociology, Political Science, Philosophy, Bengali, Islamic Studies, and Arabic.

More than 12,000 students of these departments have got frustrated as their participation in an

upcoming bankers' recruitment examination has become uncertain, many examinees told APB.

Although, teachers are supposed to evaluate the papers within three months, in many cases they are delaying up to 5-8 months more, it was alleged. The office of the controller (exam) also is not reportedly coordinating properly.

Worst-affected are the students of Law Department. Honours final examinations of the department were held in last August, but the result is yet to be published.

When contacted, DU VC Prof AK Azad Chowdhury said stern action would be taken against those department if they fail to carry out the order.
