

Primary school occupied by rice traders?

JHENIDAH, Sept. 8:—The students of Kamta Government Primary School under Jhenidah sadar thana are compelled to attend their classes in a dilapidated building which may collapse at any time although a new building was constructed.

The newly constructed building of the school is being occupied by a section of rice traders to run their business in cooperation with the school managing committee and teaching staff. The students of the school are compelled to use the old building as their classrooms.

The Facilities Department of the Ministry of Education constructed the building at a cost of Taka five lakh for the school.

The local people urged upon the authorities concerned to recover the school building from the illegal occupants.
