



All exams in DU postponed again

The Dhaka University authorities on Monday again postponed all the examinations scheduled for the next seven days, following a fresh standoff on the campus.

The decision was taken at an emergency meeting of the university Syndicate on Monday evening with Vice Chancellor Prof AK Azad Chowdhury in the chair.

Following the killing of Chhatra League leader Firoj Ahmed on Friday, DU Syndicate closed the university for three days that ended on Monday. But, another indefinite strike called by Jatiyatabadi Chhatra Dal (JCD) made the campus situation again uncertain.

As per the decision of Monday's meeting, the examinations of 67 papers of different departments and institutes were suspended for the said period.

Some 200 examinations were postponed due to the first spell of 15-day strike enforced by the BNP's student wing, JCD. More than 15,000 examinees suffered due to postponement of their final examinations.

Meanwhile, ousted from the halls as a backlash to the Firoj killing, JCD re-enforced its indefinite strike from Saturday and vowed to continue it until the authorities brought back congenial atmosphere for a peaceful coexistence.

Both the rival organisations - BCL and JCD on Monday demonstrated on the tense campus. The BCL leaders from their rally again blamed the JCD activists for the

killing.

The JCD leaders, at their rally, declared to continue their strike until VC Prof Azad Chowdhury resigned from the highest administrative post of the university.

BCL leaders warned that they would resist the killers of Firoj from entering the campus. "The campus situation will not be congenial if the killers of 100 Chhatra League activists across the country were not arrested," BCL President Bahadur Bepari said.
