Biswas's call to help build illiteracy-free nation

President Abdur Rahman Biswas on Tuesday called upon all including the teachers community to help expand the education facilities for building a sound illiteracy-free nation, reports BSS.

He was inaugurating a three-day centenary festival of the Jagannath University College at the college premises in Dhaka on Tuesday morning.

President Biswas said education was the driving force, which could help any nation to keep its head high and called for making all-out efforts in materialising the Government programme of universal education system in the country.

He referred to various nation-wide programmes taken by the present democratic Government in expanding the education facilities and said education sector had been given the highest allocation of funds in the national budget.

President Biswas pleaded for giving a new impetus to the mass-education programme to get rid the nation of illiteracy.

Recalling the contribution of the Jagannath College in the field of expanding education since it was established in 1884, President Biswas paid tributes to its founder Kishoree Lal Roy Chowdhury, a Zamindar of Baliaati village under Manikganj district.
