3,272 expelled on 3rd day of HSC exams

A total of 3272 examinees were expelled on the third day of Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) examinations on charge of adopting unfair means in the examinations.

Of the expelled examinees, 569 are from Dhaka board, 1266 from Rajshahi board, 472 from Comilla Board, 192 from Jessore Board, 625 from Chittagong Board, 61 from Sylhet Board and 87 from Barisal Board.

With Sunday's expulsion, the number of expelled examinees in the last three day's examinations raised to over 19,000.

Excepting report of injury of a Deputy Controller of Examinations of Chittagong Board, no major incident was reported during the Bengali first paper examinations on Sunday.

Sources said the Deputy Controller suffered injury after an expelled examinee pelted brick on his head while he was passing through a road.

Our Rajshahi Correspondent reports: The highest 1266 examinees were expelled from the board. The district-wise break up of the expelled examinees are: 163 in Rajshahi, 19 in Natore, 44 in Chapainawabganj, 47 in Pabna, 179 in Sirajganj, 131 in Rangpur, 253 in Gaibandha, 28 in Lalmonirhat, 84 in Kurigram, 104 in Nilphamari and 187 in Thakurgaon.

Our Comilla Correspondent adds: An official of Comilla Board filed a case on Sunday with Chaudhogram thana against 34 persons including nine students for attacking the vehicle carrying members of the Rapid Action Committee on Saturday.
