



Primary Education in Dhamrai Upazila

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EDUCATION process of primary school students is being disrupted due to shortage of furniture, class-rooms, and teachers.

Sources concerned said 85 per cent children ranging age 5 to 10 go to school. The number of dropouts is not worth mentioning. The average presence of the students of government primary schools is 85 per cent.

In Dhamrai upazila, there are 139 government primary schools, 18 non-government primary schools, two primary schools under higher-secondary schools, 5 unregistered non-government primary schools, 29 ebtedaee madrasa, 145 TNGO schools.

Around 41 thousand students are studying at these schools. The number of students at government primary school is registered at 30 thousand.

The posts of headmasters of seven schools among 139 government primary schools have remained vacant for long time. Besides there are only 530 teachers against the posts of 548 assistant teachers.

The administrative and academic activities are being disrupted due to vacancy of seven headmaster posts and 18 assistant headmaster posts.

Among on total of 335 schools in Dhamrai upazila, 86 government schools while 16 non-government schools have buildings, 24 schools have half-constructed half-buildings 26 buildings are under construction.

The condition of the vest of the schools are deplorable.

Seven thousand two hundred seventy-two students are getting benefit under food-for-education programme. ●
