## 300 SSC examinees of Sidr-hit Bagerhat taking preparation in two army-run night libraries

BAGERHAT, Feb 11: Over 300 examinees in cyclone-affected Sharankhola upazila here have been taking preparation in two army-run night-libraries for appearing this year's Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations, reports UNB.

The night libraries were opened with two rooms each at local Rayenda Pilot High School and Tafalbari High School during the early December for giving support to the Sidr-affected SSC examinees.

The examinees are taking preparation here under the guidance of teachers of different schools from evening to 10 at night.

Bangladesh Army is supplying books, papers, pens and other necessary material among the

examinees. Tiffins are also being served among them.

Commander of the district army camp Lt. Col. Syed Siddiqui said they have taken the initiatives considering the future of the affected SSC examinees.

The government has already re-fixed the date of SSC examination on March 27 instead of February 28 considering the sufferings of the examinees of the Sidr-affected areas.

Some 72 students of different classes were killed and several others injured in the super-cyclone Sidr in the district. It also damaged 841 educational institutions in nine upazilas of the district more or less inflicting loss of Tk 18.67 crore in education sector.
