

Primary teachers' memo to PM for 100pc salary

Bangladesh Non-Government Primary Teachers' Association yesterday placed an 11-point demand, including implementation of 100 percent of salary scale before nationalisation of their jobs.

They also threatened to go for a tougher movement if their demands are not met.

The teachers placed the demands at a human chain at Mukhtangan in the city.

After the programme, they headed towards the Prime Minister's Office (PMO) at 5:00pm and submitted a memorandum to the prime minister to press the demands.

But police put up a barricade at Paltan intersection to obstruct their movement. Later, a five-members delegation was allowed to carry the memorandum to the PMO.

The team comprised President of the organisation

Md Samsul Alam, Secretary General Migendra Mohan Saha, Mir Giasuddin and Kazi Kamal Pasha.

The demands include introducing house rent allowance, treatment allowance, festival allowance, enlisting headmasters in salary scale and ensuring allowance to the teachers of three hill districts.

The teachers will observe a dawn-to-dusk hunger strike at Central Shaheed Minar on June 29.
