

MEDICAL ADMISSION *Protester's continue demo*

THE admission seekers to medical and dental colleges on Thursday continued their demonstration for the 19th day at the Central Shaheed Minar protesting at the police attack on their fellows during the student strike on Wednesday.

Police on Wednesday dispersed the protesters, who have been seeking cancellation of medical admission tests alleging question leak and demanding fresh tests, charging baton at Karwan Bazar as they were heading towards health directorate to submit a memorandum.

The demonstrating admission seekers would organise a Teachers-Students solidarity rally in front of national

museum at Shahbagh in the capital around 3:00pm today to press home their demands.

Tanjira Bishas, one of the co-ordinator of the ongoing movement, made the announcement at the Central Shaheed Minar at noon.

Speaking at the protest rally, she criticised the health minister's remarks on medical admission tests and admission seekers movement.

Tanjira said, 'we have documents of question leak, if anyone wants to see the documents we'll show.'

She urged the government to meet their demands by Friday.

After the rally, admission seekers brought out a protest procession from the Central Shaheed Minar that paraded important points on the Dha-

ka University campus.

The aspirants of medical and dental colleges had been demonstrating to press home their four-point demand that included taking measures to prevent question paper leak and forgery, cancellation of recently held medical and dental admission tests and re-take of it, exemplary punishment to the perpetrators and ensuring punishment to the law enforcers who attacked on agitating students.

The results of MBBS and BDS admissions tests, with a success rate of 58.4 per cent, were published on September 20.

The protesting students alleged the questions were made available to a large number of students on September 17, a day before the exams.
