Campus violence causes session jams, says IU VC

ISLAMIC UNIVERSITY, July 3.—Prof. Enamul Hoque, Vice-Chancellor of Islamic University, said that the varsity will remain open although clashes occur and dead bodies lay on the campus. He was talking to the delegation of Islamic University Journalists Association (IUJA) on June 27.

At the beginning of the interview, the newly appointed VC Dr. Enamul Hoque exchanged greetings.

The Vice-Chancellor apprised the journalists of the campus situation and different academic and administrative measures taken by the authorities that include introduction of academic calendar to remove the session jams, setting up of a card phone booth, improvement of the environment in the residential halls and campus of imposing of ban on political activities on the campus and forming two investigation into allegation against the guilty persons who were involved in question leakage of the admission test on April 26 and in the killing of a guardian on April 28 in a clash between JCD and the Shibir.

The VC assured the journalists to solve the problem and the journalists assured him cooperation in implementing the measures.

The VC said closure of university again and again was the main cause of session jams. The varsity must remain open any how.

But he refused to discuss the matter why he ordered the concerned department to admit Shamim Akhter who was admitted to the Dept of Islamic History and Culture on January 7 last after 7 months of the admission date, the journalists said.
