



## 100 pc salary for non-govt teachers demanded

The Bangladesh Teachers Association has demanded 100 per cent salary for the non-government teachers and urged the government to make provision in the budget. "When the present Prime Minister was the opposition leader she extended her absolute support to our movement and we expect that she will fulfil our legitimate demand", said Md Selim Bhuiyan, Secretary General of the Association at a Press conference held at the National Press Club on Tuesday morning.

Selim Bhuiyan alleged that the maximum budget allocation goes to the government schools and colleges though the 90 per cent students of the country are enrolled in the private educational institutions. He demanded of the government to follow the ILO and UNESCO proposal and implement unified salary scale and facilities for same qualified government and non-government teachers.

The association also demanded cancellation of school managing committee system at the non-government schools. It also demanded to free the educational institution from political influence, extension of services of English teachers upto the age of 60 and above. The press conference was also attended by association President Kazi Abdur Razzaq and other leaders.
