



BUET classes resume Aug 11

## 3 students expelled for Sony killing

The authorities of Bangladesh University of Engineering and Technology (BUET) have expelled three students and awarded 22 others various types of punishment for their alleged involvement in Sony killing and other anti-disciplinary activities, reports BSS.

The Board of Residence and Discipline (BRD) Committee of

BUET expelled Mokammel Hayat Muki, a part-time student of M Sc (Engineering), Sharif Imam and Saiham, both students of final year of B Sc (Engineering) on the charge of killing meritorious BUET student Sabequunnahar Sony and other offences.

The 22 other students were also awarded punishments of different types such as suspension from the BUET for different terms, suspension from residential halls and warning.

The punishments of the 25 students were finalized following an investigation that began after the recent killing of Sony. The BUET authorities formed a six-member probe body, headed by Dr. Anwarul Haq, Professor of IPE Department to conduct the investigation.

The probe body submitted its report to the BRD Committee on July 16. The BRD Committee held several meetings on the report and finally awarded punishment to 25 students on August 4.

BUET authorities said that the classes would resume on August 11 as per its earlier announcement.
