

DUTA concerned over push-in by BSF

Dhaka University Teachers Association (DUTA) on Saturday expressed concern over the tense situation prevailing along the Bangladesh-India border centring the push-in attempts of Bangla speaking Indians by the Border Security Force (BSF) of India. reports BSS.

In a statement signed by DUTA President Dr Mohammad Agadzaman and General Secretary Dr Farul Kabir, said the attempts to push Indian citizens into Bangladesh territory are unjust and irrational.

The DUTA leaders also refuted India's claim that a huge number of Bangladeshi citizens are living in India illegally. They said the push-in attempts are not a good neighbourly behaviour.

The DUTA leaders said such attempts may create confusion on the existing bi-lateral relations between the two countries and may disrupt peace in the region.

They hoped that India should remain abstain from such attempts for the sake of good neighbourly relations between Bangladesh and India. "We believe that this problem could be solved through bi-lateral discussion," they observed.
