800 expelled during SSC exams on 4th day

Nearly 800 examinees were expelled for adopting unfair means on the fourth day of the Secondary School Certificate (SSC) and Dakhil and SSC Vocational examinations across the country on Monday.

A total of 12 invigilators were also expelled for assisting examinees in copying in the examination centres. Bangla Second Paper examination was held on the day (Monday).

With the Monday's expulsion the numbers of expelled students and teachers rose to 5,800 and 130 respectively in four days.

State Minister AHN, Ehsanul Haque Mithon on Monday during a surprise visit suspended two invigilators from Gazaria Kalimulla College centre of Munshiganj district for negligence to their duties.

The Minister also visited in various examination centers of Daudkandi, Chouddagram and Chandina upazila of Comilla district.

On the 4th day, the tendency of copying remained low in comparison to last three days for the efforts made by the Education Ministry like summary trial court, restriction on people's movement and introduction of concealed video cameras.

A total of 9,33,652 examinees from different schools and madrasas under seven education boards—Dhaka, Rajshahi, Comilla, Chittagong, Jessore, Barisal, Sylhet, one Madrasa Board and one Technical Education Board are appearing in the examinations at 1,241 centres.

Of the examinees, 80 were expelled from Dhaka Board, 202 from Rajshahi Board, 28 from Comilla Board, 54 from Jessore Board, 41 from Chittagong Board, 22 from Barisal Board and 2 from Sylhet Education Board. Besides, 222 examinees were expelled from different centres under Madrasa Board on charge of adopting unfair means.
