

1000 HSC examinees expelled on 2nd day

Around one thousand examinees were expelled for adopting unfair means on the second day of the Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC), Alim and Fazil examinations.

Two teachers were expelled at Rajshahi for their alleged involvement in abetting cheating activities with examinees.

Some 843 examinees were expelled from seven general education boards, 35 examinees were expelled from the Madrasah Education Board and 67 examinees were expelled from Technical Education Board during the English 2nd paper examination, held on Saturday.

The trend of cheating in examination has declined than the previous year for the government stringent measures to check unfair means in examination including summary trial court, fine, restriction on people's movement and footage by video cameras at the examination centres.

Two hundreds and forty examinees were expelled under the Dhaka Education Board, 154 from Barisal and 106 from Jessore Education Board.

Thirty-nine examinees were expelled from Chittagong Education Board, while the Rajshahi Education Board expelled 389 examinees.

As many as 47 students were expelled under the Sylhet Education Board, and the Comilla Education Board recorded 91 students as expellees.

A total of 659,826 examinees are appearing in the examination at about 16,000 centres across the country under Dhaka, Rajshahi, Comilla, Chittagong, Barisal, Sylhet, Jessore Education Board and the Bangladesh Madrasah Education Board and Technical Education Board.
