Lot of group politicking on SUST in a dire strait!

SYLHET, Apr. 11.—Politics and fun are killing the prospect of students of Shahjalal University of Science and Technology that remained closed for more than a month, says UNB.

Frustrated, most students including six from Nepal had left for home finding no prospect of early reopening the classes.

It all started with refusal by the VC to allow study leave to a teacher on March 8. Teachers rallied political support and the employees behind them, formed a liaison committee and demanded resignation of the Vice-Chancellor.

A rival group—SUST Rakhyata Parishad—has cropped up that

planned for reopening classes and resuming normal administrative work on Sunday next.

But the Liaison Committee in its renewed move has decided to start sit-in demonstration on the campus from Sunday.

And a group of general students frustrated at the situation have decided to go for fast-unto-death on Sunday demanding immediate reopening of the classes.

Informed sources said a number of politicians had lengthy parleys during the last few days. But instead of resolving the problem, the narrow-minded politicians by taking sides have widened the differences of the rival groups, the sources said.
